Job Description County Council Representative to Sectional Council

General Description

The 4-H YDP County Council Sectional Council Representative:

Serves as a liaison between the County 4-H Leaders' Council and Sectional 4-H Leaders' Council.

Advocate for the needs of San Diego County 4-H members, their families and the 4-H Volunteers in the development of Sectional 4-H Learning programs and Events.

Qualifications

Must be an approved 4-H volunteer with the San Diego County 4-H YDP.

Must be an active member in good standing with the San Diego County 4-H Leaders' Council.

Must be able to attend Sectional 4-H Council Meetings and to County 4-H Council Meetings.

Have the ability to communicate with youth and adults.

Have a working knowledge of all aspects of the San Diego County 4-H YDP.

Commitment to 4-H YDP mission and core values.

Duties

Prepare and present to the Sectional 4-H Leaders' Council a written report on the activities and highlights of past, present and future San Diego County 4-H learning opportunities and accomplishments.

Regularly attend the Sectional Leaders Council Meetings and the County Council Meetings.

Communicate with the Sectional Leaders Council any directive or items of importance identified by the San Diego County Council, its officers or the 4-H staff in the county.

Report back to County 4-H Leaders' Council Sectional all actions and decisions taken by the Sectional 4-H Leaders' Council. Work in a cooperative manner with the other counties' elected or appointed members who sit on the Sectional Leaders' Council and any 4-H staff assigned to provide oversight to the Sectional Council.

Be available for consultation with the San Diego County Council President.

Support the mission and core values of the University of California 4-H YDP.

Adhere to University of California policies.

The 4-H YDP County Council Rep to Sectional Council accomplishes his/her duties by working with:

Job Description for Emerald Star Advisor (adult)

Must be an approved volunteer leader in good standing with the San Diego County Leader's Council, have strong communication skills, a desire to work with youth and attend the Emerald Star Advisors Training. Individual must be able to encourage and mentor youth through process of planning and facilitation an Emerald Star Project.

As an Emerald Star Advisor it will be your responsibility to familiarize yourself with the current Emerald Star Packet and adhere to the timeline as well as all the guidelines. Adult Advisor must be able to work as a team with a Youth Emerald Star Advisor. Advisor will need to be available for advice and suggestions throughout the length of each project. Advisor will conduct at least two interviews for each project and plan to attend the event if possible. Advisor will be a member of the Emerald Star Committee. The Emerald Star Committee is responsible for approving the applicant's project and hear the applicants oral report at the completion of the project.

Time required: 3 to 4 hours per month

Job Description for Emerald Star Advisor (youth)

Must be 14 years of age and a 4-H member in good standing with the San Diego County 4-H Program, have been awarded the gold star or Emerald Star, have strong communication skills and attend the Emerald Star Advisors Training. Individual must be able to encourage and mentor members through the process of planning and facilitation an Emerald Star Project.

As an Emerald Star Advisor it will be your responsibility to familiarize yourself with the current Emerald Star Packet and adhere to the timeline as well as all the guidelines. Youth Advisor must be able to work as a team with an adult Emerald Star Advisor. Advisor will need to be available for advice and suggestions throughout the length of each project. Advisor will conduct at least two interviews for each project and plan to attend the event if possible. Advisor will be a member of the Emerald Star Committee. The Emerald Star Committee is responsible for approving the applicant's project and hear the applicants oral report at the completion of the project.

Time required: 3 to 4 hours per month





Fashion ¢ents, the 2011 Challenge category will be the \$15 Challenge. Members are challenged to coordinate and purchase an entire outfit for \$15 or less, not counting shoes. 
