4-H Fire Recovery Project

Are you interested in getting involved with fire recovery efforts? Do you want to know more about how digital photography, GPS, and computer mapping can aid in restoring natural areas destroyed by wildfires? Join the 4-H Fire Recovery Project to make a real difference in your community and learn the exciting techniques that are being used to monitor and restore San Diego County's natural areas. The 4-H Fire Recovery Project will provide youth with the tools to collect environmental data in areas of the county that were recently burned by wildfire, in turn providing county workers with valuable information about how burned vegetation is recovering from fire.

The project is just getting up and running, so it is the perfect time to join and get involved with the fun activities planned for the summer! Two workshops are planned for this summer, the first will be a field trip (several field trips will be planned so that individual groups will not have to drive too far) that will go over some basic photo-monitoring techniques with digital cameras as well as several activities designed to familiarize groups with GPS units. The second workshop will take place at the UC Cooperative Extension office in Kearny Mesa to introduce groups to Geographic Information Systems (GIS) where each group will learn how to manipulate the software, enter GPS points into a computer map, and create and print out a map of the groups photo-monitoring site locations.

As groups become more familiarized with spatial technologies, each group will have the opportunity to pick an environmental research activity that will be conducted at a photo-monitoring site and will involve the use of GPS, digital photography, and computer mapping. Some examples of possible research activities include water quality monitoring, plant identification, and soil monitoring. When the group has finished their activity they will be able to create and print out a map showing the location of their activity site as wells as the data collected during the activity. Data logs, printed maps, and posters will be saved to add to a personal portfolio for each group member.

If you would like to learn more about this project we will be having an introductory meeting on July 24th from 10:00 am to 12:00pm at the UC Cooperative Extension 4-H Office. We will review the project in detail, set up times for groups to attend field trips, and distribute the Fire Recovery Project kits to each group. Each group will be outfitted with a backpack kit that contains a laptop computer, a handheld GPS unit, a digital camera, field binoculars, a compass, a first aid kit, wildlife field guides, and much more! The project is designed for youth groups ages 12-19 who are interested in a long-term (6 months to a year) commitment to the program. You do not currently have to be in 4-H to join the project, so please encourage friends and family members to get involved!
